This year's theme for Respect Life Sunday is "Every Life is Worth Living." A truer statement could not be made.

The Christmas classic "It's a Wonderful Life," tells the story of a beleaguered man who feels that the lives of his family and loved ones would be better served had he never been born. After an eye-opening adventure with Clarence the Angel, George discovers that his life had a major positive impact on those whose lives he had touched. It is a powerful story, beloved by many.

In reality, every life given by God is a miracle. Each of our lives has an impact on the other humans who we encounter. We often miss this truth in a world where the disabled, elderly and infirmed are deemed weak and the unborn are denied the right to life. The stories below

beautifully illustrate how God uses the weak to lead the strong.

In October of last year, 12-year-old Carin Richardson of Michigan reacted quickly to save her baby sister, Jac'Lynn, from drowning in the family's backyard pool. The girls' mom stated that this was particularly impressive because Carin has Down Syndrome and it is unusual for kids with Downs to act so quickly. Many babies who receive the prenatal diagnosis of Down Syndrome are aborted. But, in this instance, beautiful Jac'Lynn is very grateful that her big sister was around to help.

This past June, an elderly man was responsible for saving the lives of many when a road in Chongqing, China collapsed in front of his house due to a landslide. Rao Guohua waved away more than 50 vehicles, warning them of the danger. He took his meals out on the road and stayed up all night until authorities could re-direct traffic. Drivers and passengers have visited Rao at his home to thank him for saving their lives.

Days after Baton Rouge Police Officer Matthew Gerald was gunned down in a July 17th ambush, his wife Dechia was told by her youngest daughter that "Jesus told me that there is a baby boy in your tummy." Dechia was thrilled when a pregnancy test confirmed that she was indeed pregnant. She feels her husband's presence all around her and is hoping that the baby is a boy with her husband's beautiful blue eyes that she fell for years ago. "There's no better gift that a husband could leave behind than a baby, a gift from God. There's no better gift than that," said Mrs. Gerald.

So, this Respect Life Sunday and every day, may our hearts be full of gratitude for Life, in every stage from the moment of conception until natural death. Every life is a miracle. Every life is a gift. Every life is worth living.

Guiding Star Update

Guiding Star Ministries is our maternity home located in the Germantown section of Philadelphia. The Pro-Life Union adopted Guiding Star last fall as a tangible sign of our commitment to the sanctity of life and to ensure that pregnant women and their children have a place to call home. The mission is to provide shelter to pregnant women and their children so that they may have a successful, healthy pregnancy while creating a beautiful home that is welcoming, nurturing, structured and supportive. Since last fall, we have housed ten women, eight children and eight unborn children. Our phones ring daily with requests for support from pregnant women facing homelessness. And, we have a waiting list of eight women.

This is an incredible endeavor and encompasses both the spiritual and corporeal works of mercy. Last month we had the home blessed and prayers were offered with the moms and children. Residents participate in programming including faith sharing, parenting classes and healthy living. We hope to add in a sewing class and a book club as well.

We invite you to consider joining the Pro-Life Union in this work that affirms the sanctity of life! We are always working on updates to the home, and our needs are great.

Board Spotlight

Regina O'Reilly recently stepped down after many years of Board service. She has been a faithful participant in all Pro-Life Union activities and we are so grateful she is staying involved. 
