Latest Abortion Stats

The state of Pennsylvania recently released the appalling 2016 abortion statistics. As always, it is a somber time to recognize the loss of life as we look at these numbers.

There was a total of **30,881 abortions** in the state of Pennsylvania. Nearly half (15,124) were performed on white women, 12,984 on black or African American women, and 2,937 to Hispanic women. 87% of Pa. abortions were performed on unmarried women. Nearly 39% of the women aborting were residents of Philadelphia County. There were 155 complications reported and **223 abortions** performed on girls *15 years of age or younger*.

There is so much work to do. Education and petitioning our public officials to change abortion laws, providing help for women who feel helpless and doing everything possible to CHANGE A CULTURE is essential.

We can only begin to accomplish this through prayer, witness and offering real alternatives to abortion.
