We Can Help You - And We Will By: Tom Stevens, President and CEO, Pro-Life Union

Oftentimes when standing outside abortion centers, as we reach out to women (and men), we say, "You don't have to do this—there's help! There are options, information, support, assistance, housing, community, clothing, counseling, as well as other forms of help. We want to help you and we want to help your baby. There's no problem or difficulty so insurmountable that you can't overcome it. You are stronger than you think you are!" We can truly help...and we will.

Jhanee was one example. She was living in a friend's van while putting herself through school. She was pregnant and in need of help. She heard about our maternity home, Guiding Star (it could have just as easily been another home for pregnant moms such as Cradle of Hope, Our Lady's House, Mother's Home, etc.). She met with the Guiding Star director and when there was room, Jhanee moved in and expressed how the home really helped her. Two years later she's independent, working, living in an apartment, and raising her 10 month old child. Later Jhanee contacted us because her employer cut her hours and she was having troubles paying rent that month. We had her complete a 'rental assistance' application and state her need (including her plan to not continue to be in this situation). While Jhanee was visiting our office to receive a check for rental assistance made out to her landlord, she mentioned that she had no furniture in her apartment. Two days later someone called me and said she wanted to donate furniture to the Pro-Life Union, I said, "Thank You, Lord!"—I know someone who needs some furniture. Pro-Life Union board member, Patrick Stanton, and a moving company delivered it to her apartment.

That's what we call the Continuum of Care. If a mother is unexpectedly pregnant, homeless, or in some other challenging situation, we say, "We can help." And we do help. She gains housing at Guiding Star (or some other home), support, counseling, parenting classes, community, and other ways of assistance. Then she moves into independent living and we stay in contact. If she needs help again, she will know where to turn.

To illustrate the concept, we receive these types of calls:

• "Hello, my name is Renee and I am 20 years old. I'm pregnant and looking for a place to stay."

- "Hi, I have 3 kids and just left an abusive relationship. I've been living on the streets for two days. Please help me."
- "I'm pregnant, have a 11 month old child, and need help finding a job."

Remembering Their Lives: Memorial Cross Program

The Pro-Life Union's Memorial Cross Program for the unborn consists of a set of 61 white crosses, each representing 1 million abortions since the Roe v. Wade landmark decision in 1973. The memorial crosses do create an impact. Mothers who have lost a child through abortion have come and placed flowers as a part of their healing. A mom considering abortion called our hotline for help. These crosses are a powerful reminder of the number of children not given the chance to live. Title X Recipients Can't Refer or Provide Abortion Services


The 9th U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals let stand its June 20th decision, which makes clinics ineligible for Title X family planning funds if they provide abortion referrals. This is part of the Trump Administration's Protect Life Rule. Abortion advocates are displeased by the ruling, especially Planned Parenthood, which will lose about \$60 million in funding each year.

PA Lawmakers Advocate for Heartbeat Bill

Two Pennsylvania lawmakers—Sen. Doug Mastriano (R-Franklin County) and Rep. Stephanie Borowicz (R-Clinton County)—are pushing the Heartbeat Bill, and have invited Senate colleagues to become co-sponsors. Sen. Mastriano distributed a memo on July 17th requesting support for it, and stated that science "shows more than 90 percent of all pregnancies are viable when a heartbeat is detected." This bill will require all physicians before proceeding with an abortion to determine whether the baby has a heartbeat; if it's detected, the abortion cannot be performed. Gov. Wolf has said this bill would be vetoed if it reached his desk. However, Mastriano and Borowicz believe a scientific approach could at least win some people over, and is worth a conversation.

Roman Catholic Church's Teaching About Ectopic Pregnancy

In the Pro-Life Union's July 2019 newsletter, a local student's essay about the



sanctity of human life was included, which stated her personal opinion about ectopic pregnancy that "...under no circumstances is murdering an innocent life ever acceptable. No matter what obstacles the mother has to face during her pregnancy, there is always a way to seek help and guidance." An ectopic pregnancy refers to an embryo that does not reach the uterus, but will instead implant in the fallopian tube, which is not designed to support a pregnancy. This type of pregnancy is considered high risk, possibly resulting in the deaths of both mother and child. Is it moral to kill the unborn baby if it means saving the life of the mother?

According to the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops, the Roman Catholic Church teaches the following: "In certain cases, such as…ectopic pregnancy, it is morally licit to remove the threat of the mother's life…by removing part, or all, of the fallopian tube where the child implanted, even though it is forseeable that the child will die as an indirect and unintended effect of such surgery. Abortion, a direct and intentional attack against the child's life, is never morally licit."
