And, sadly many young men have been told that abortion is a woman's decision, and he should not interfere. He stays silent, she feels alone, abortion is chosen or she embarks on parenting alone. All of these factors and more contribute to the fatherlessness in our communities.

Today the Knights of Columbus serve as a wonderful antidote to fatherlessness. Their example encourages all men and fathers to speak for the vulnerable and work to strengthen families. It is truly beautiful to witness the Knights serve women and children in need through their charitable efforts. We have had full team of volunteers and supporters helping us spruce up our maternity home! In mid-May the Culture Project visited along with The St. Vincent de Paul Community Outreach group. The front rooms in the home were renovated and redecorated to allow for more space for counseling and discussion. We continued with our room renovations upstairs ensuring we can house more families in need.

The staff coordinates weekly parenting and life skill classes for residents and of course the team at Catholic Social Services continues to support our families with Case Management. This fall we plan to begin hosting a monthly brunch for residents provided by families who wish to support the program. We are also looking for individuals to offer volunteer handyman services. It has been an amazing year for this very special maternity home and we are so grateful for the support and prayers of so many.

The Pro Life Union is so excited to welcome Karen Gaffney as our keynote speaker for this year's Stand Up for Life Dinner. Karen is the president of the Karen Gaffney Foundation, a non-profit organization headquartered in Portland, Oregon "dedicated to championing the journey to full inclusion for people with Down syndrome and other disabilities." In 2001 she became the first person with Down Syndrome to complete a relay swim of the English Channel. Her 2007 swim across the nine mile span of Lake Tahoe became the subject of the documentary, "Crossing Tahoe: A Swimmer's Dream." Karen received a standing ovation for her witty and inspirational Tedx talk entitled "All Lives Matter" in Portland, Oregon. A Father's Love

In 2007, Heath White, a pilot-turned-FBI agent from Texas learned that his wife Jennifer was carrying a baby with Down Syndrome. He explained that he did everything he could to convince her to have an abortion, but Jennifer refused. Paisely was born on March 16th and though he smiled in photos, White said that he did not feel connected to his daughter. "My main concern was what people would think of me – what weakness inside me caused that. I felt like I was getting a broken baby." It was only a few months later when he realized that Paisley was no different than any other child. "I tickled her and she laughed and giggled at me and I realized that she's just like any other kid – she's my kid." He wanted to show the world just how proud of being her father he was.

Heath was a marathoner and before her first birthday, he placed her in a special stroller and they ran their first race. Heath and Paisely became an unstoppable duo, winning medals and logging over 321 miles. When Paisely turned five, Heath knew that he would no longer have to carry her and that she could run on her own. He wrote a letter to his daughter describing the way that he had felt before she was born. "That could have been my dirty secret that I kept with me forever, but I wanted her to know that she was everything to me. My love for Paisely is perfect."
