Always Forward

As we look back through 2015 and the many gifts you shared, we wanted to share a few highlights from the year.

With your help, we were able to:

- Pray and witness year-round outside abortion facilities in Philadelphia and the region, including two 40 Days for Life Campaigns.
- Train 30 new volunteers in sidewalk counseling.
- Encounter hundreds of men and women outside abortion facilities, through our staff and volunteers, to share the message of truth about the dignity of life.
- Host over 200 people during rallies as part of a nationwide response to videos revealing Planned Parenthood's practices.
- Staff the Pregnancy Hotline 24/7 to respond to pregnant women vulnerable to abortion.
- Add text messaging as an option on the Pregnancy Hotline for more women to reach a trained counselor.
- Respond to the need for safe housing for 12 pregnant women vulnerable to abortion, and their 16 children, through Guiding Star Ministries.
- Renovate 7 bedrooms, 4 bathrooms, and the playroom at Guiding Star to better serve families.
- Provide counseling through Catholic Social Services for mothers at Guiding Star.
- Distribute diapers and baby supplies to families in need throughout the region.
- Educate thousands through our efforts on Mother's Day, Respect Life Sunday, and at the Stand Up for Life Dinner.
- Meet with lawmakers and build strong relationships in Harrisburg and Philadelphia to uphold laws protecting life.
- Grow the Union's membership to 3,000 strong across the Philadelphia region.
- Support our 10 member organizations in their efforts, from restoring the culture to promoting adoption.

Memorial Crosses



A very poignant way to educate folks about the travesty of abortion is our Memorial Cross display. A total of 56 white crosses are placed on lawns of churches and schools with a sign which explains that each cross represents **one million** abortions in the United States since the 1973 Roe vs. Wade ruling. The crosses usually stay at a location for one month and they will be delivered, set up and retrieved by a volunteer from the PLU. Famous and Fortunate!

In the past, you have heard the accounts of famous people who were born despite their moms being told that they should abort their children. Andrea Bocelli, Justin Bieber and Tim Tebow's stories have been featured in our Updates. But there are others whose tales may surprise you. According to the website Rebel Circus, Celine Dion credits her mom's parish priest for convincing her mother not to abort. Cher's mom backed out at the last minute, telling her own mother, "Mother, I can't do it." Jack Nicholson's mom was pressured by peers, but said no. Yoko Ono considered aborting son Sean Lennon, but John Lennon encouraged her to continue the pregnancy. Steve Jobs was almost a victim of abortion and years later, he thanked his birthmom for the sacrifice she made. And Pope John Paul II's mom was advised to abort him after having a daughter die shortly after birth, but she defied her doctor's orders. It is sad to think of the amazing people who have lost their lives to this terrible tragedy, but we are certainly thankful to the moms and dads who chose life for their own wonderful celebrities!
