## **Everything is Grace**

A few weeks ago a young woman called our pregnancy hotline very late at night. She spoke softly through her tears, hoping, begging someone would listen. That afternoon, she had gone to Planned Parenthood for an abortion. The regret settled into her soul quickly and deeply. She explained how sick she had been feeling, her family and her boyfriend didn't want the baby and Planned Parenthood pressured her, saying "don't delay." They told her it would be easy, it would quick and she just wanted to forget everything.

Abortion is rarely a choice made freely and few women understand the loss that will be experienced. The offers of help are hard to believe and undermined by the company selling abortion. So she walked past the people praying, but she took the brochure because they were so kind, she said simply, "why didn't I stop to talk to them."

God's grace was acting in her heart, and she was receptive to the message of love and mercy. She talked for a long time with the counselor and was directed to Rachel's Vineyard. She texted a few days later with gratitude for the support she received and shared how she had started going back to church. "We know that all things work for good for those who love God, who are called according to his purpose."

### **Mother's Day Activities**

The celebration of Mother's Day is of great significance to the Pro-Life Union. We reflect on the goodness of Mary, the mother of Jesus, our own mothers, the mothers who we are able to give support to and in a special way, the mothers who are hurting because of the loss of a child.

### **Down's Syndrome**

According to some studies, as many as 90% of children diagnosed with Down's syndrome before birth are aborted. Often parents are frightened into the decision without all the information about the resources and support available for children and families facing a disability. Every life matters and has value. Many families have become more outspoken so that the world will come to better understand what Down Syndrome is and how the diagnoses will impact a person's life in a positive and beautiful way. On March 21<sup>st</sup>, Down Syndrome Day, touching and powerful stories were shared by parents who, at first, feared the diagnosis of Down's Syndrome, but then came to celebrate it as a gift. Most families expressed feelings of love and pride in relation to family members who had Down's Syndrome.

One father writing in mercatornet.com summed up his feelings beautifully, "Moreover, people with Down Syndrome teach those around them to love unconditionally. Our family is a greater community of love with our daughter in it than it was before. She really has been everything that other families have said about having a member with Down Syndrome. All of those great joys have come to our family along with — and, I dare say, because of — our daughter's initial diagnosis, which had seemed so sad to me at the time."
