A Pro-Life Family Example

There is much public lamenting about the high cost of college tuition. We can identify one college where students are receiving a priceless course in "Family 101" at no charge.

Mountain McGillivray was hired by Generation Life in 2005 and served as a fantastic speaker and educator who charismatically spread the message of life and chastity to thousands of teens in the Greater Philadelphia area. After leaving Generation Life, Mountain and his family moved to Connecticut. He coaches the women's basketball team at Quinnipiac University in New Hampshire. The team has been very successful, winning 52 games in the last two years including a 30-3 season this past year. The Quinnipiac Bobcats went undefeated in the Northeast



Conference, won the conference title and played in the NCAA Tournament. We caught up with Mountain recently so we could share how he and his family remain active in the pro-life movement.

Mountain is married to Grace, and they are expecting their sixth child in December. Their home school group, *Adore Te*, provides fantastic fellowship and witness to what it means to be Catholic parents. This past July, they and another family ran the first life chain in their town of Cheshire, CT. About 70 people lined up for life. Mountain and Grace also help with the 40 Days for Life campaign in the Hartford Diocese, have hosted Gen Life for a church talk

and a teen conference, and Mountain has been giving pro-life talks to the CCD for the past three years.

When asked how he first got involved, Mountain shared that his grandfather, Anthony Coppa, asked him to pray at a Vigil at Planned Parenthood when Mountain was 13. He recalled the enormous impact that sidewalk counseling and prayer made on him even at that young age. "I think everyone feels compelled to come back again, to pray and offer hope to mothers" and so Mountain stayed involved. Quinnipiac University can never offer its students more than watching the McGillivray family develop. No text is necessary, no lectures or classes are required. This observation is fundamental to the reality of family life in any human society. The critical roles of mother and father, when properly exercised, cause their children to virtually blossom. This family is a blessing at so many levels, but what a beautiful gift to these fortunate students. Thank you, Grace and Mountain, for personally illustrating Marriage and Family in such a compelling way.

Elisa

One of the blessings of working in the pro-life movement is the wonderful people you encounter. One of our members, Elisa, has faced many challenges in her life. Now in her early 50's, she looks back on these obstacles, and with joy, marvels at how God's grace and protection have been manifested in her life. Elisa's mother intended to abort her, but miraculously, Elisa was spared and she has had a deep sense of peace, despite her troubled childhood, that "God had a plan for my life." As a college freshman, Elisa became pregnant. She was advised by her doctor that the baby would be severely handicapped and he encouraged her to choose abortion. But, God's grace and love won out and she chose life. Her son Daniel was born whole and well. She considers herself spared from abortion twice and feels blessed beyond measure. Elisa continues to share her story about being saved from abortion with those she encounters. And she makes an incredible contribution to our movement. Thank you, Elisa!

Feminist author Holly Grigg-Spall has written a new book about the birth control pill. It asks provocative questions regarding "the Pill" and how it has impacted the lives of women.

"Contrary to cultural myth, the birth-control pill impacts on every organ and function of the body, and yet most women do not even think of it as a drug. Depression, anxiety, paranoia, rage, panic attacks - just a few of the effects of the Pill on half of the over 80% of women who pop these tablets during their lifetimes. When the Pill was released, it was thought that women would not submit to taking a medication each day when they were not sick. Now the Pill is making women sick... In a bid to spark the backlash against hormonal contraceptives, this book asks: "Why can't we criticize the Pill?"



True Beauty



Artist Tazia Fawley, spent six months painting "Rupert Flies Over the Suspension Bridge." Heart and Sold, an organization supporting artists with Down Syndrome, discovered the painting and offered it to the Royal Couple for their newborn baby. William and Kate do not normally accept gifts but decided to make an

exception and in so doing, celebrated the life and gift of the artist who has Down Syndrome. Suzie Moffit, the director of Heart and Sold said, "In England, there always has been a stigma attached to (Down Syndrome), and now that is washed away by the fact that the Duke and Duchess have accepted that painting. For this to happen, it's kind of turned that negativity around."

Miracle Baby

When she was pregnant with her daughter Abigail Rose Beutler, doctors told Congresswoman Jaime Herrera Beutler, a pro-life Rep from Washington State, that her baby had a potentially fatal diagnosis that would claim her life shortly after birth. The child had been diagnosed with Potter's Syndrome, a condition which prevents the child's kidneys from developing properly and is typically fatal. In an interview with the Today Show, the congresswoman said that baby Abigail will need a kidney transplant in the year ahead, but her parents and doctors consider the child a miracle. "She is doing amazing," Jaime said. She and her husband,



Daniel, hope their experience sends a message to other parents who may be in similar situations. "We had more doctors tell us 'no' than tell us 'yes,' and there are other parents who have had similar experiences," she said. "We'd like this to be part of the conversation when this diagnosis comes again, so these parents have an option."



Steve, Goodbye for Now!

The pro-life movement lost one its warriors, Seve Santoleri, in September. During his last five years, he carried the cross of cancer without complaint and remained involved in the pro-life movement even in the toughest parts of his illness.

His brother Dave, summed up Steve perfectly at the funeral Mass held at St. Cornelius Church on September 17th. "So who was Steve Santoleri? A wood worker, a wine maker, a sailor, a beekeeper, a DuPonter, an entrepreneur, A King's Man, A Man of Malvern, a Knight of Columbus, a friend of Jesus, a mentor for Generation Life, a witness for our Lord, a man of strong Faith, and a Family man - who has many, many friends."

No exaggeration was required by David, just the simple recounting of his brother's life lived by following Jesus. Steve was involved in every area of the Pro-Life Movement and shared his time, talent and treasure so generously. His work with Generation Life has left an enormous impact and it was beautiful to see the vibrant team of missionaries and full-time staff at the funeral Mass. So many people came together to thank the Lord for Steve and to comfort his family.

Lord, we thank you again for your man, Deacon Steve Santoleri, who did so much for the Culture of Life and inspired so many to also follow Jesus. Please join us in praying for the happy repose of his soul.
