### **Pregnancy Hotline**

In April, television ads reaching out to abortion-minded women began running in the Philadelphia area. The callers were directed to the pregnancy hotline answered by Pro-life Union volunteers. The volunteers did great work over the eight week campaign. It is truly amazing to encounter so many women simply looking for direction and support. Women often seek abortion because they feel they have no other choice, but kindness and offers of material support such as diapers, gift cards or help with rent can change a woman's decision. Lack of adequate housing, family support and financial resources are the most common reasons women give for considering abortion. If we can work together as a pro-life community to meet the physical needs of women in crisis, then we can invite them to seek the spiritual and emotional healing they need. The Pro-Life Union is so grateful to have partnered with Heroic Media and our area Pregnancy Centers to meet the needs of these women so that they can choose life. #### **Shedding Light**

On Good Friday, a few pro-life volunteers entered into a discussion with an angry supporter of abortion. He spoke repeatedly about the "services" offered by Planned Parenthood, focusing mainly on preventing unplanned pregnancy. When he was asked "Do you know how many abortions were done here at Planned Parenthood?," he did not have the answer. He was surprised to hear that 5,652 children lost their lives in the year 2013. Abortion is a contentious subject, and the defenders of the practice prefer to keep the conversation about "choice" and "women's rights." We can easily be led into various conversations about the issues surrounding abortion, but by remaining focused on the lives lost, we shine a light on the tragedy of abortion and hearts can be open to change. Below is a chart showing the number of abortions performed in our own neighborhoods and towns.
