

Member Organization Spotlight: Rachel's Vineyard (featuring Emily Welfield)

It's important to remember how we can help women everyday through prayers, resources, and compassion, even after an abortion experience. Rachel's Vineyard offers retreats and resources for men, women and couples who are dealing with postabortive emotions so they may begin the process of restoration, renewal and healing. Here is Philadelphia native Emily Welfield's personal testimony about her journey toward healing.

"My story begins with losing my virginity when I was thirteen years old. I was raped. That unresolved trauma led me to be very sexually active, which resulted in an unplanned crisis pregnancy at the age of sixteen.

It was decided by my parents that I would have an abortion and I was taken to the abortion clinic against my will. I asked for help from the staff at Planned Parenthood and stated that I was not there willingly. To my surprise, my cries for help fell upon deaf ears. I was degraded by the adults there and was told that I was acting like a child. During the ultrasound, I heard my baby's heartbeat loud and clear. That was it for me. Halfway through my ultrasound I stood up and ran out of the room and found myself up against a door. That is the last thing I remembered as I struggled to wake up in the recovery room. I imagine that I was drugged to keep quiet because staff at Planned Parenthood were concerned that I would scare the other women there preparing for their abortions.

I woke up in the recovery room feeling empty and in a state of total shock. I was slumped over in a chair in a group with the other girls and the first thing I saw when I opened my eyes was blood; I knew right then that my baby was gone. I felt small, weak, powerless, and violated.

The shame, guilt, and pain I felt in the following days left me suicidal. Everything around me was a reminder of the betrayal and murder of my baby. So, not much time passed when I found myself turning to opiates to numb the pain.

By the grace of God, a friend recommended that I go on a Rachel's Vineyard Retreat. During the weekend of my retreat, I was touched by God's loving embrace and His Mercy and forgiveness. I was finally able to grieve the loss of my child and entrust his soul to Jesus. Our Lord showed me that I was to go forward to live my life in honor of my child. I believe Rachel's Vineyard saved my life. I am now happily married to a wonderful man and we are blessed to have a beautiful little boy."



Adoption and Possibility

I have been blessed to be a part of the Pro-Life Union for 33 years and have told my story to very few people. The compassion that I've experienced in the pro-life movement has made me realize that my experience is not one to be ashamed of, but one to share.

At 16, I found out that I was pregnant. I felt alone, embarrassed and terrified to tell my parents, but when I finally did, they reacted in the sweetest of ways; I know they loved me unconditionally—flaws and all. Abortion never occurred to me, but in the seventies, it was still taboo to be 16 and pregnant. My mom found a home for unwed mothers in Florida, and while it was hard to leave my friends and family, it was comforting to be with girls that were facing the same situation. Some of the girls chose to parent, while others chose adoption. I wanted the baby to have what I had growing up: a big, loving family, and a mom and a dad who would love the child unconditionally.

On May 15, 1977, a baby girl came into this world. I chose not to see her because I didn't want to waver in my adoption decision. But my mom held her and told me that she was beautiful. I moved back to Pennsylvania, met my husband and married in 1983. We are blessed with three extraordinary sons, the joys of my life. All these years later, I can clearly see how parenting would have taken me on a different path. I don't think my husband and I would have met and my boys would not have been born. Adoption allowed me to live the life God had planned for me. It opened the door for my marriage, my sons, and my involvement in the pro-life movement.

I became involved in the pro-life movement after my second son was born. I understand the fears, anxieties and concerns of women facing unexpected pregnancies. It is a blessing to be part of an organization that helps women choose life for their children, and it is especially heartwarming to hear about other women who selflessly give the gift of life to couples through adoption.

I often think about my only daughter and wonder if she is now a mom or maybe a musician like her birthmother. Many years ago, I surrendered her to the Lord, and I pray that she is happy and healthy and the joy of her parents' lives. I am grateful that adoption allowed her to experience life and God's plan for her.

Kathy Barnette's Mom Chose Life!

When Fox & Friends Political Analyst Kathy Barnette was preparing to enter the Army Reserve at 18 years old, she realized by finding a copy of her birth certificate that her mother was only 12 years of age when Kathy was born. It was then that she discovered that she was conceived during the rape of her mother. This knowledge made her adamant about the sanctity of all life. "Aborting me would not have eased the trauma my mother suffered or allowed me to be in a place where I can take care of my mother." Kathy recently told her story at the Annual Open Board Meeting of Abington Hospital. "I am eternally grateful to my mom. She had me." Kathy's powerful witness left an inmact on those who attended. Pray that Abington Hospital stops aborting. Kathy also gave her testimony at the March For Life in front of the Supreme Court Building.
